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# Who are we?

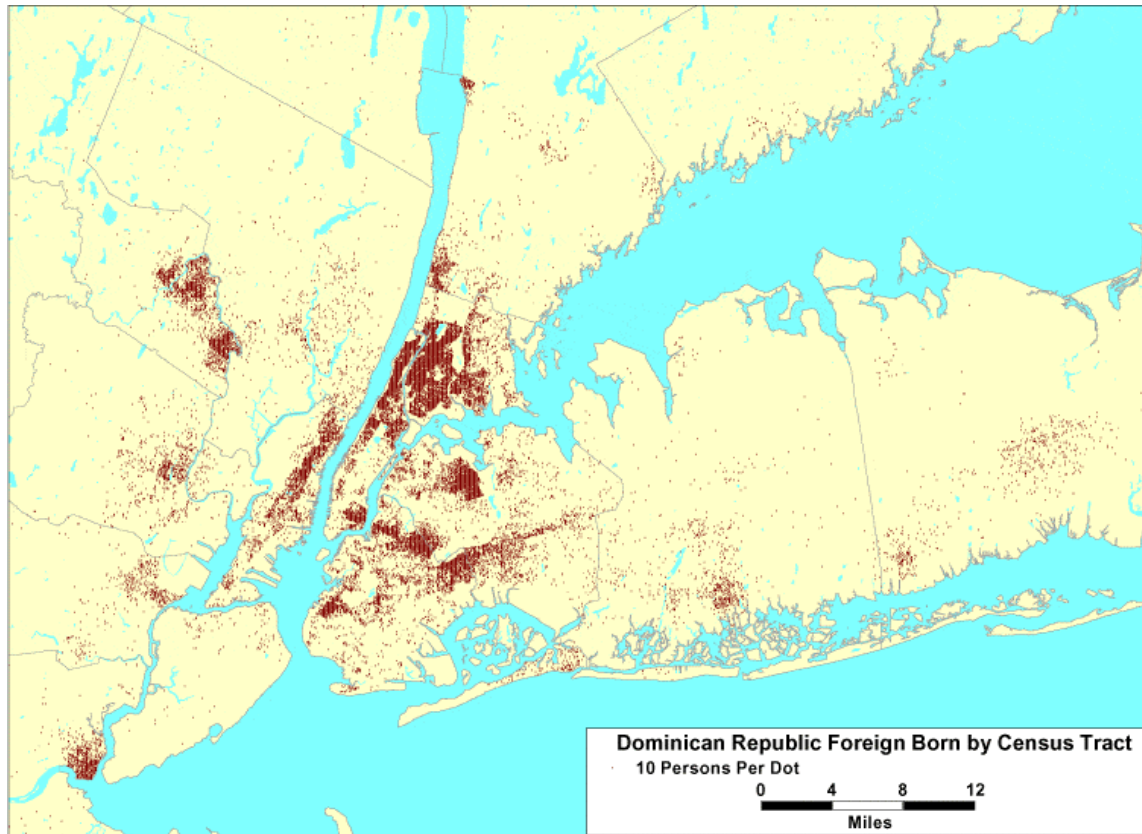

# Dominican Diaspora in the U.S.

- Population was 1,041,910 (2000)
- Fourth largest Hispanic/Latino group
- 1 out of 3 is U.S.-born
- Average per-capita household income and labor force participation are below national average.

# Human Capital

- Dominicans have higher enrollment rates - at both high school and college levels- than other minority groups.
- For U.S.-born Dominicans in NY, some college education attainment rose from 31.7% in 1980 to 55.1% in 2000.

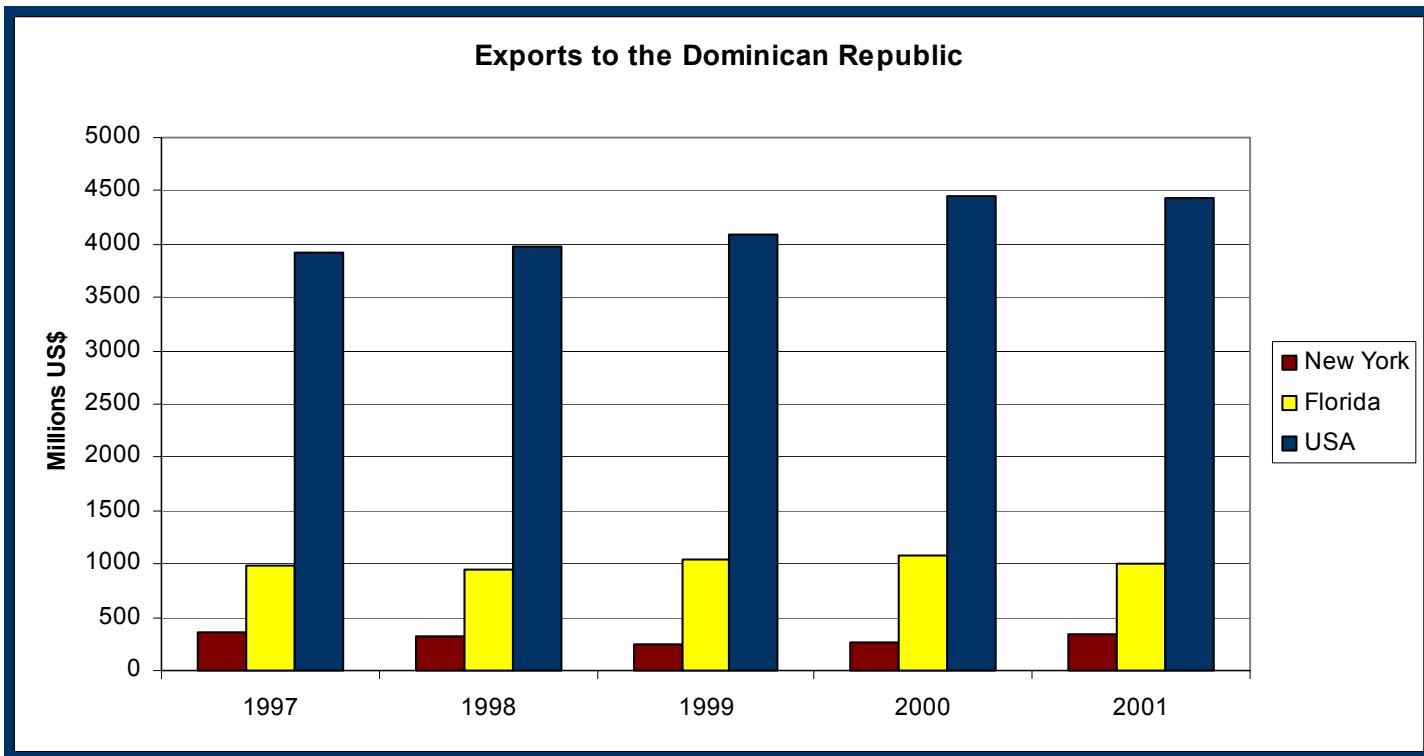

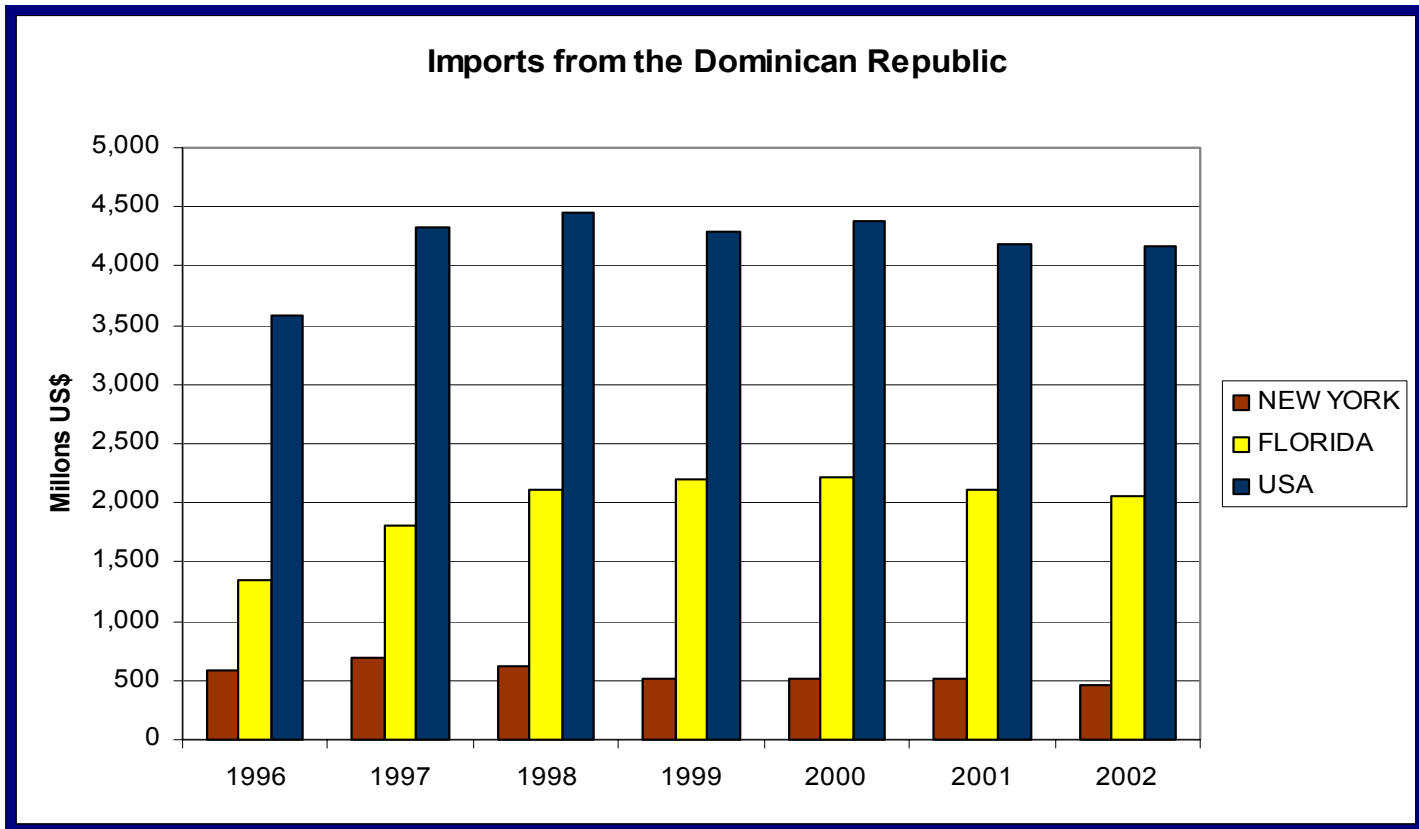
