
National Photo and Video Social Media Competition





This mask is a long-standing tradition of the area, and resembles the cimarron slaves from the 18th century. The Cachuas from Cabral are very unique and one of the most notorious masks throughout the country due to the colors, horns, and cross on the back of the costume.



The program revolves around the "three golden rules" - or 3Rs - for the proper management of solid waste: reduce, reuse, and recycle. The workshops demonstrate and emphasize the idea that recycling waste and transforming it into art strengthens both the individuals and communities alike. he EcoHuertos program seeks to support the creation of organic and sustainable vegetable gardens in schools and communities throughout the Dominican Republic. It also supports hands-on workshops in the field of natural sciences contained in the educational curriculum. The program generates awareness of the importance of a balanced diet, and contributes to food security and independence as well as the creation of small local business. In 2015, the EcoHuertos program continued generating great interest across the country and growing not only in creating school gardens but also family and community gardens. This year, a total of 50 new vegetable gardens have been established and a number of workshops have been offered on topics such as basic gardening, pollinators and pests, and organic fertilizers, among others.





The mission of the *Dominican Republic Encyclopedic Dictionary of the Environment*, both the book and the online version, is to offer the most complete and up-to-date information on the environment and natural resources of the Dominican Republic, and to present projects undertaken by public, private and non-governmental sectors on behalf of the environment, as well as existing legislation on its protection, and its impact on the nation's sustainable development.

Since the online version launch in 2008, the *Dictionary of the Environment* seeks to increase awareness around the dangers of a contaminated and abandoned environment, while at the same time promoting its respect, care, reasonable use, and protection. To cope with the many environmental challenges that the modern world faces and to ensure an effective conservation and protection of our natural environment, the global community requires informed and concerned citizens.





The *Dictionary* has been available online in Spanish since 2008 and in print since 2011. In 2012, GFDD launched the online publication in English. These online versions are enriched every day with up-to-date news and articles, and new entries provided by writers and contributors of different areas of expertise.

The *Dictionary* unites information on the environment and natural resources of the Dominican Republic, incorporating information from a wide range of disciplines, including chemistry, physics, geology, biology, atmospheric engineering, earth and soil sciences, geography, demography, economics, and law.

In an effort to continually promote understanding of environmental topics and respect for the natural environment, and expand its reach to new audiences, GFDD disseminates the content of the encyclopedic dictionary in a variety of formats, including photography exhibits, calendars, and the "Google Earth Tour of the Coastal and Marine Ecosystems of the Dominican Republic," which is part of the "Explore the Ocean" layer of Google Earth.





he Fellows Program, an extension of the internship and academic exchange program InteRDom, was created in 2009 to develop a community of scholars that contributes to the Foundation's growing body of research on matters of international concern that directly impact the Dominican Republic. The Program provides opportunities for M.S., M.A., and Ph.D. candidates interested in conducting high-level research in the Dominican Republic on issues related to sustainable development. The final output of the investigation is a comprehensive report, which includes empirical data. Fellows organize research in coordination with GFDD and Funglode staff, National Academic Advisors, and their university professors. Those students that carry out exemplary work have the opportunity to present their findings before the United Nations community and other institutions around the world. Their research results are published in the GFDD Research and Ideas Series.



Lead Environmental Economist at the World Bank, Author of the publication *Greening India's Growth: Costs, Valuations and Trade-offs*

The session discussed Dr. Mani's career background as an environmental economist and the role that environmental resources play in economic growth, otherwise known as Green Growth. The discussion further elaborated on the best practices that could be transposed from Dr. Mani's analysis of the Indian economy to help promote the sustainable development of the Dominican Republic.

The session considered the importance of public sector climate finance and the role of civil society in reducing greenhouse gas emissions and helping communities to adapt to climate change. Fonseca explained that his work at the GEF required him to have "a bird's eye view" of the organization's portfolio given that it "deals with all the international dimensions of the global environment, including biodiversity, land management, climate change mitigation and adaptation." Fonseca emphasized that making investment take a greener path would be the key paradigm shift to affect a successful transition to sustainable development.

The session focused on the work of the OAS with regards to sustainable development, and in particular the importance of public participation and engagement with all relevant stakeholders to ensure effective public policy making in this field. De Windt explained that the concept of sustainable development had guided the work of the OAS since the early 90s, seeking to incorporate the concept with its objective of poverty eradication.

The Americas and Access to Infrastructure and New Technology

Ambassador Bautista discussed the outcomes of the 45th Regular Session of the General Assembly of the Organization of American States (OAS), held on June 15 and 16, 2015 in Washington, D.C. He also provided the viewers with a summary of the OAS Ministerial Meeting organized in Honduras on October 19th and 20th, and gave his view on the effect of the potential inclusion of Honduras to the Trans-Pacific Partnership agreement being negotiated by 12 Pacific Rim countries, including the United States.



Chinese-Latin American Trade Relations

December

Margaret Myers

Director of the China and Latin America Program at the Inter-American Dialogue

"Chinese demand for commodities has been transformative, particularly for Latin America"

Myers discussed the work of her organization analyzing the trade relations between China and the Latin American Caribbean (LAC) region, looking in particular at the impact of recent political and economic development within the two regions. The session also looked at the changing role of Chinese foreign direct investment within the LAC region, with Myers observing that China is becoming increasingly "less focused on construction commodities and more focused on consumer goods", which could in turn have a positive impact for the LAC region. Myers reminded viewers that China had been a significant investor within the region over the last ten years, as over \$10 billion had been given out in loans to the region to support its industrialization.

Oral Statement Calls for Enhanced Public Participation during the 53rd Session of the Commission for Social Development

February 4/13 - New York, US

GFDD was present for the fifty third session of the Commission for Social Development, which took place from February 4 to 13, under the Priority Theme "Rethinking and strengthening social development in the contemporary world". During the session, GFDD's UN Representative, Mr. Marc Jourdan submitted an oral statement on behalf of the foundation calling for a new social development agenda, where public participation of communities is enhanced and economic decisions are conditioned by social and environmental outcomes.

Written Statement on the Eradication of Violence against Women in the Dominican Republic

March 10 - New York, US

Following the Opening Ceremony of the 59th session of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW59) on Monday March 9, 2015, the Global Foundation for Democracy and Development (GFDD) released a written statement on the topic of the eradication of violence against women, calling for a coordinated response to this pandemic at all levels and by all relevant stakeholder groups. The document points to the fact that violence affects the lives of millions of women worldwide and is one of the huge and growing impediments to gender equality and empowerment of women.

Publication Launch: Joint Study on The Elimination of Violence Against Women

The event, which was organized in parallel to the CSW 59, was attended by close to 100 participants.









Third Session of Post-2015 Development Agenda Intergovernmental Negotiations: Goals and Targets

The meeting charged Member State delegates with hammering out a post-2015 development agenda. Along with countries, GFDD and Funglode submitted a written statement which raised questions around possible technical revisions to a list of proposed goals and targets, put forward last July, and provided input on how to craft relevant indicators to measure success.



GFDD and Funglode submitted a joint written statement to ECOSOC on April 28th, as part of the civil society hearing on the longer-term positioning of the United Nations development system. The written statement is one of six interventions that have been accepted for publication on the ECOSOC website. Focusing on ways the UN may adapt to the new requirements of the Post-2015 Development Agenda, the document calls for the need to strengthen technology transfer in developing countries and highlights the importance of innovative partnerships to free up new sources of development finance.







Panel Discussion on the Challenges of Financing for Development

May 22 - New York, US

GFDD partnered with the NGO Committees on Financing for Development and Social Development to hold a panel discussion entitled Do We Have the Courage to Put People and Planet First? The Challenges of Financing for Development during the Intergovernmental Negotiations on the Post-2015 Development Agenda. The event was moderated by Barbara Adams, Senior Policy Advisor of the Global Policy Forum, before a packed auditorium comprised of civil society representatives, UN Member State delegates and UN agency representatives. Invited speakers included H.E. Ambassador David Donoghue, Permanent Representative of the Permanent Mission of Ireland to the United Nations; Jamil Ahmad, Deputy Director of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) New York Office; Miguel Aldaz, Lead Specialist for the Office of Partnerships at the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) and Marc Jourdan, GFDD's UN Representative & Environmental Programs Coordinator.

UN Publication Launch: Fellows Study by Henry Montero on the Impact of Cognitive Behavioral Therapy for Parkinson's Disease Patients

June 11 - New York, US

GFDD hosted a special side event at the United Nations during the 8th Session of the Conference of States Parties to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD). The event presented the research study carried out by Henry A. Montero, a 2014 GFDD fellow on the topic of 'Treating Parkinson's Disease Psychosis with Cognitive Behavioral Therapy'. Before an engaged audience comprised of members of civil society, UN Member State delegates and UN agency representatives, Montero presented his study confirming that Cognitive Behavioral Therapy improves practical thinking and diminishes the delusions of Parkinson's disease patients. Montero was joined by other guest speakers including H.E. Ambassador Choong-hee Hahn, Deputy Permanent Representative of the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Korea to the UN; Dr. Olga B. Soto-Moise, Board Certified Geriatric Psychiatrist; Dr. Jayme Albin, Expert Psychologist in Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) and Dr. Beatrice Goodwin, Chair of the NGO Health Committee.





Oral Statement during 2015 High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development

July 9 - New York, US

The theme of this year's meeting was "Strengthening integration, implementation and review — the HLPF after 2015." The meeting brought together nearly 1,800 delegates, including Member States, Major Groups, and other stakeholders, and intergovernmental and UN organizations. GFDD delivered an oral statement during the conference to stress that engaging local communities and civil society in development initiatives is crucial to ensure these projects are truly sustainable and lead to the creation of long-term collaborative relationships.

Celebrating the Role of Civil Society in Promoting the UN's New Development Agenda

July 21 - New York, US

GFDD put together a side event during the final Intergovernmental Negotiations on the UN's Post-2015 Development Agenda, at United Nations headquarters. With the participation of academic experts and NGO representatives, GFDD moderated an engaging panel discussion highlighting the role that local communities and youth groups can play in promoting sustainable development and the UN's new development framework.

UN Film Screening: Lago Enriquillo: A Prelude to Climate Change

June 29 - NY, US

Seeking to provide a space for showcasing climate action and concrete initiatives, GFDD put together a special UN side event that joined high-level policy experts and government representatives with the Director of Lago Enriquillo: A Prelude to Climate Change, Fernando Báez, for an engaging debate on the topic of climate change. The event was followed by a panel discussion on climate change, seeking to present how this issue has affected the planet and what efforts needed to be made in Paris by the international community to reach a bold and ambitious climate treaty. In addition to Báez, the speakers included several international experts on environmental issues such as Omar Ramírez, Executive Vice-President of the National Council for Climate Change and Clean Development Mechanism of the Dominican Republic; H.E. Ambassador Ahmed Sareer, Permanent Representative of the Permanent Mission of the Maldives to the United Nations and Chair of the Alliance of Small Island States; and Jamil Ahmad, Deputy Director, UNEP New York Office.

A Busy Year for GFDD's UN Programs


With the 59th Session of the Commission on the Status of Women (registering a record turnout of participants: more than 8,600 civil society activists), the General

Assembly's High Level Event on Climate Change and the historic adoption of the UN's 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, 2015 was a busy year for GFDD's UN programs! Underscoring the value of gender equality, promoting the necessity to mitigate and adapt to climate change and highlighting the importance of achieving people focused sustainable development, both in the Dominican Republic and abroad, the Foundation participated throughout the year in the UN agenda. As part of this effort, the Foundation delivered 5 oral and written statements, held 15 events and panel discussions, launched 3 GFDD Fellows publications, broadcasted 5 GFDD Global Roundtables, posted 111 blog posts on environmental protection issues and international affairs and participated in 19 UN conferences.

UN Publication Launch: Fellows Study by Hilary Lohmann and Mat Rosa on Climate Change and Its Impact on Coastal Communities and Resources

October 1, 2015

To celebrate the release of its latest publication in the Research and Ideas Series entitled Climate Change in the Dominican Republic: Impact on Coastal Resources and Communities, GFDD/Funglode hosted GFDD Fellow Hilary Lohmann for a special presentation of her work at the UN Church Center in New York. The presentation was followed by a panel discussion with policy experts including Dr. Ruben Torres, founder and president of Reef Check Dominican Republic, and Karen Kent, Senior Coastal Resources Manager at the Rhode Island University Coastal Resources Center. The event highlighted the vulnerability of Small Island Developing States such as the Dominican Republic to the impacts of climate change. The launch event was also held at Funglode headquarters in Santo Domingo on October 7 and at the University of Rhode Island on October 29.



Historic Agreement for Dominican Cinema with the New York Film Academy Signed

January 9 - New York, US

Dr. Fernández, on behalf of GFDD/Funglode, signed an agreement with the President of the prestigious New York Film Academy (NYFA), Michael Young. With this agreement, Dominican film students pursuing academic film programs in the U.S. will receive a 25% tuition fee discount and will also have the possibility of taking courses in the Dominican Republic. The alliance represents a milestone in the history of the Dominican film industry. This agreement opens a space for the young Dominican film industry, to be able to support local talent through better training.

Participation in Sustainable Development Solutions Network

January 26 - Santo Domingo, DR

Dr. Fernández was invited to join the Leadership Council overseeing the work of the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN), an initiative designed by the Secretary General of the United Nations (UN) to assist in solving global problems. The invitation was issued by the Director of the network, leading U.S. economist Jeffrey Sachs, who is also Director of the Earth Institute at Columbia University and Special Advisor to the UN Secretary-General on antipoverty measures known as the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).





Urging Educators Not to Replace Arts for Science and Technology

February 16 - Santo Domingo, DR

The opening of the 26th Annual Conference of the Association of Academic Programs in Latin America and the Caribbean (AAPLAC) marked the beginning of a 4-day conference for more than 50 representatives of international exchange programs in the U.S. and Latin America. President Fernández gave the plenary address, while Minister of Higher Education, Science, and Technology, Ligia Amada Melo, gave a summary of the country's international scholarship program in the auditorium of Funglode. Sessions were also held at the Autonomous University of Santo Domingo (UASD), Instituto Dominico-Americano, and Universidad Iberamericano (UNIBE).

Global Leaders Discuss How to Engineer a Resilient Economy

April 14 - Miami, US

Dr. Leonel Fernández and 200 other global leaders met in Miami to discuss, within the framework of the fifth edition of the World Strategic Forum, the way to engineer a resilient economy in an environment rich in opportunities and political, economic, and environmental challenges.

Encouraging Latin America to Teach More Scientific Research Methodology

April 16 - Miami, US

Fernández made this statement during a visit to Unicaribe College, an institution of higher education established in Florida by Dominican entrepreneurs with the aim of providing vocational training to Hispanics in the United States. According to Dr. Fernández, both the Dominican Republic and Latin America in general have serious deficiencies with respect to the field of scientific research methodology, so it is urgent to strengthen this area of higher education.

President Highlights the Achievements of the DR in Strategic Alliance with Florida

April 17 - Miami, US

Dominicans and Florida business professionals, cultural, and academic leaders meet at Florida International University (FIU). Leonel Fernández said that projects like the NAP of the Caribbean in Santo Domingo's Cybernetic Park and the Instituto Técnico Superior Comunitario of San Luis arose as a result of the Strategic Alliance Dominican Republic - State of Florida initiative, launched by his government a decade ago.



SBS Agreement, New Films to be Made in the DR

May 6 - Miami, US

Dr. Leonel Fernández oversaw an inter-agency partnership with the Spanish Broadcasting System (SBS) to produce and market a series of films through the Dominican film industry. Dr. Fernández met with Cuban-American businessman, Raúl Alarcón, president of the SBS group, at the company headquarters. They stressed that this partnership agreement, which will involve an initial \$25-million-dollar investment, seeks to provide decisive support to the development of the film industry in the Dominican Republic.

Cooperation Agreement Signed with Inter-American Defense Board

May 15 - Santo Domingo, DR

The agreement was signed by Dr. Leonel Fernandez, and Vice Admiral Bento Costa Lima Leite de Alburquerque Junior, in his capacity as Director General of the Secretariat of the Inter-American Defense Board. It aims to encourage an exchange of information, publications, books, documents, research papers, and experiences between the two organizations.

Lecture on Political Science at Catholic University of Santo Domingo

May 28 - Santo Domingo, DR

Dr. Leonel Fernández welcomed the fact that many Dominicans are studying various aspects of Political Science at the Catholic University of Santo Domingo (UCSD), in a lecture marking the official launch of the Political Science Degree Program being offered by the University.

Dr. Fernández joins UNSDSN, a Global Initiative for the United Nations

June 5 - Paris, France

Dr. Leonel Fernández was elected member of the Leadership Council of the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network (UNSDSN). This organization mobilizes global scientific and technological expertise to promote practical problem solving for sustainable development, including the design and implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals, at the local, national and global level.

Addressing Research Congress on Innovation

July 6 - La Vega, DR

Dr. Leonel Fernández was the keynote speaker at the closing of the First National Congress on Research, Innovation, Science, and Technology, organized by the Catholic Tech University of Cibao (UCATECI). In his speech, Dr. Fernández urged the country's universities to intensify their efforts to produce innovative knowledge that can be registered as patents, thereby gradually closing the technology gap the country is experiencing as compared to others around the world.

Urging Latin Americans to Lean More Toward the World of Technology

In his speech at a dinner at the Hispanic IT Executive Council Leadership Summit, Dr. Fernández referred to a report done by the Community of Latin American and Caribbean States (CELAC in Spanish), which projects a mere 1% economic growth in Latin America for the coming years, mainly due to the slowing down of China's economy.

August 30 - Quito, Ecuador

The inauguration took place during the eighth meeting of the Foundation's Executive Board, held at the Ministry of Foreign Relations and Human Mobility of the Republic of Ecuador.

Dr. Leonel Fernández signed an agreement with Medgar Evers College in New York to create a platform for reflection on Caribbean subjects, including perspectives on history, economics, politics, and the culture of his country as well as that of Cuba, Haiti, and Puerto Rico.

Center, celebrated the 9th edition of its Annual Awards for Short Story, Poetry, and Documentary. 


Climate Change Adaptation in the Dominican Republic: Impact on Coastal Resources and Communities by Hilary Lohmann and Mat Rosa

The book studies the Dominican economic model, in particular, it analyzes the impact of external sectors on the economy and the effect of economic growth on job creation and the labor market. In the same way, it discusses the conventional justification for a Free Trade agreement and explains why such an agreement can be counterproductive if there are asymmetries in the productive capacity.



Status of Women: Studies and Reflections in the Dominican Republic and Latin America

The publication contains a study prepared by the Dominican Political Observatory (OPD) of Funglode that analyzes Dominican women in four crucial areas: education, labor market, political participation and violence in its most extreme manifestation, femicide. The study considers the history behind the legal framework that provides equal conditions to Dominican women, as contained in laws, codes, treaties and international conventions. The publication is a co-edition by GFDD and Funglode. The book was launched at the UN on March 18. (see p. 117).
